Brief Ideas of Australia

Australia Capital Territory

Within New South Wales is a territory known as the Australian Capital Territory (ACT). This territory was established in 1913, and contains the Australian capital city of Canberra, the Namadgi National Park, and acres upon acres of agricultural land. Canberra is the capital of the federal government of the Commonwealth of Australia, and this area was established for the governance of the country.

New South Wales

New South Wales (NSW) is one of the states on the eastern side of Australia. Approximately 7.24 million people live in NSW, most of which live and around the capital city of Sydney. There are eleven universities that are located in this region of Australia, including the University of Sydney, which is the largest and most wellknown. There are also several universities that are based in other states but have campuses in Australia

Queensland

Queensland (Qld) is the second-largest region in all of Australia. There are approximately 4.5 million residents in the state of Queensland, and the population is actually evenly distributed throughout the state. Even though the capital, Brisbane, has the most residents, it only accounts for approximately 45% of the state's population. The University of Queensland and Queensland University of Technology is one of the top 100 universities in the world. There are also a handful of other universities in the state as well.

Victoria

(which is approximately 5.3 million) resides in and around the capital, Melbourne. There are eight public universities found in Victoria, including the University of Melbourne and Monash University (the largest university in the country). If you, as an international student, decide to go to Victoria for schooling, you won't be alone – 30% of the state's student population is made up of international students.

Western Territory

Western Australia is the largest state in Australia, but it has one of the smallest populations. There are approximately 2.4 million people who live in the state, and over 90% of the population lives in the south-western area of the state (near the capital, Perth).

The Northern Territory

The Northern Territory is in the north-central region of Australia. The Northern Territory is the least populated of all of the Australian states and territories with only about 250,000 people living there. The capital of the Northern Territory is the city of Darwin The country only has one university, Charles Darwin University (formerly known as Northern Territory University), which focuses on a variety of higher education and vocational studies.

Tasmania

Tasmania is a state made up of the island of Tasmania, directly south of the state of Victoria, and the 334 islands surrounding it. It is recognized as the southernmost point of the country of Australia. The state has a total population of approximately 600,000 and most of them reside in and around Hobart, the capital. There are campuses for other universities found in Tasmania, but the largest public institution in the state is the University of Tasmania, which has 3 campuses throughout the state

South Australia

South Australia (SA) is in the south central part of Australia. The population is only 1.6 million people (less than 8% of Australia's total). Most of the population resides in and around Adelaide, the capital. South Australia only has three public and three private universities. They also have one vocational school (TAFE South Australia).



Australian Goverment scholarships are not available for international students undertaking English Language training specifically in Australia. However, there are several English Language training scholarships offered by Australian institutions. Its very important to apply before the deadline. Please visit individual university websites for more information. Early application is always advised.

ENGLISH REQUIRMENTS

What is the minimum English language proficiency test score required for an Australian student visa?

Your required level of English language proficiency will vary depending on your desired institution and level of study, your country of citizenship and whether you plan to complete an **ELICOS** course upon arrival in Australia. For student visa applications, the table below outlines the minimum scores accepted for each test. Certain courses, such as nursing, education or law programs, tend to have stricter requirements. However, requirements for Vocational Education and Training **(VET)** courses are usually lower.

It's important to note that while the table shows the minimum scores required for a student visa, you will likely need a higher score to gain entry to your course. For undergraduate courses, the following scores provide an indication of the minimum requirement at most universities:

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Will I need to meet English language requirements?

Most students will need to meet English language requirements to gain entry into their course and receive a student visa.

Students are exempt from providing evidence of English language proficiency with their visa application if they fall into one of the following categories:

- Students who have completed at least five years of study in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, South Africa or the Republic of Ireland.
- Citizens and passport holders of the UK, USA, Canada, New Zealand or the Republic of Ireland.
- Students who have successfully completed the Senior Secondary Certificate of Education or study at Certificate IV level or higher in Australia within two years of applying for a student visa.
- Students enrolled full time in school studies as a principal course (including secondary exchange programs), postgraduate research or a standalone ELICOS program.
- Foreign Affairs or Defence sponsored students.


All other students will need to provide evidence of English language proficiency (in the form of a Confirmation of Enrolment or English language test scores).

What English language tests are accepted in Australia?

There are five English language tests accepted for student visa applications in Australia:

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) internet-based test (paper-based test is accepted from limited countries)
- Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE)
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic
- Occupational English Test (OET).

It's important to remember that for results to be accepted, the test must have been completed no more than two years before the application is made.



HOW TO CALCULATE FINANCIAL CAPACITY NEEDS TO BE SHOWN TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOME AFFAIRS.

Financial Capacity is one of the requirements to be granted a student visa. Student need to show a certain amount to the Department and that this fund is accessible during your study. How much money you need to show to the Department?

- 1. Annual tuition fees.
- 2. Annual living cost.
- 3. A return ticket equivalent.

The total amount need to be shown is 1+2+3

A simple calculation to help you understand :

Jay is going to study Bachelor of Business with annual tuition fees **\$25,000.00**, annual living cost set by Department for single application is **\$21,041.00**, and 1 return ticket from Jay's home country to Australia is **\$2,000**.

So in total, Jay needs to show: **\$25,000 + \$21,041 +\$2,000 = \$48,041**We hope that this information can be useful for you who is planning to study in Australia. The amount can be different if you are bringing your spouses,

Annual Living Cost update 23/10/2019

Annual living costs amounts for students, guardians and accompanying family members - 23/10/2019

On 23 October 2019, the annual living costs amounts for students, guardians and accompanying family members was updated in line with Consumer Price Index (CPI) increases to mitigate the risk of visa holders falling into financial hardship during their stay in Australia.



- 1. for a primary applicant: an increase from AUD20,292 to AUD21,041
- **2.** for a spouse or de facto partner of the primary applicant: an increase from **AUD7,100 to AUD7,362**
- 3. for a dependent child: an increase from AUD3,040 to AUD3,152
- 4. annual school costs: an increase from AUD8,000 to AUD8,296
- **5.** personal annual income if there is no secondary applicant: an increase from **AUD60,000 to AUD62,222**
- 6. personal annual income where there is a secondary applicant: an increase from AUD 70,000 to AUD72,592

Future financial capacity evidence requirement updates will be made on an annual basis in line with the CPI increases, with implementation at the end of each financial year.

Adjustments in the CPI are provided by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). We expect the next increase will occur after July 2020

STUDENT NEEDS TO BE COVERED BY OSHC FOR THE WHOLE DURATION OF THEIR STUDENT VISA

Length of stay for Student visas

The length of stay is based on the course you intend to study. The 'expiry date' of your Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) and any welfare arrangements (where relevant) will also be taken into account.

Subject to the 'expiry date' of your OSHC and any welfare arrangements (where relevant), your length of stay will generally be as follows:

Length of course	Length of stay
10 months or longer, finishing at the end of the Australian academic year (November to December)	We will usually grant a visa stay period to 15 March of the following year
10 months or longer, finishing from January until October	We will usually grant a visa stay period of 2 months longer than the course
Less than 10 months	We will usually grant a visa stay period 1 month longer than the course

The maximum length of stay for a Student visa will generally not exceed 5 years.

From 1 January 2017 the Research Training Program (RTP) replaced the International Postgraduate Research Scholarships (IPRS) program. 

TIPS ON HOW TO GET A SCHOLARSHIP IN AUSTRALIA

Scholarship can assist international students to study in Australia to help pay for their tuition fees. Check out our scholarship tips and advice to assist with your scholarship applications and increase your chances of receiving sponsorship.

Participate in community life

While many scholarships for international students are based on academic merit or financial need, remember that some scholarships are awarded for community participation. This includes community service or participation in community groups, clubs and sporting teams. Australian institutions often look for students who are active in their community and show leadership skills, so ensure you mention any relevant activities in your scholarship cover letter. Even if you are applying for academic or financial need scholarships, community participation can improve your application.

Apply for as many scholarships as possible

There are many scholarship opportunities in Australia, so we recommend that you apply for as many as possible. Don't limit your search to the education institutions — scholarships may also be offered by residential colleges, the Australian Government, international organisations and government departments in your home country. University scholarships for international students are often awarded by specific faculties (the science faculty, for example), so be sure to enquire with your faculty. Many are only available to students entering particular courses who are from certain countries (Latin American students studying tourism or Indian students studying business, for example).

Ask for help with applications

Your scholarship applications are very important — they are often the only means of awarding scholarships, so it is important that your application is clear and without errors. Unfortunately, a simple mistake might result in your application being rejected. Common mistakes relate to spelling and grammar issues, lack of detail and poor presentation. To prevent any mistakes when you apply for scholarships, ask a trustworthy source who is fluent in English to review your application, such as a friend, parent or teacher.

Read the scholarship criteria carefully

Before applying for a scholarship, check that you have submitted everything that is required. Make sure that your application meets the deadline, answers all questions asked in sufficient detail, meets word limits and is accompanied by any required supporting documentation. Supporting documents may include a personal statement, a letter of offer, your employment history, references or proof of English language proficiency. Remember that some documents may need to be certified or translated. If you have any questions about your application, you should ask the scholarship provider before submission to ensure you have applied correctly.

WORK WHILE YOU STUDY

Working while you study in Australia can help complement your overall experience. Most students do some amount of paid work while studying. It is important to be aware of some specific rules that may affect you if you'll be working while on a student visa. You should also understand your rights as an employee.

Work Rules for International Students

International students in Australia on a valid student visa can work for up to 20 hours per week while school is in session, and there is no limit on the number of hours an international student can work during recognized school vacations. A work week in Australia is considered to be Monday through the following Sunday. Although they are allowed to arrive in Australia up to 90 days before their course begins, students are not allowed to begin working until after their courses have begun.

The 20-hour-per-week limit does not extend to any work the student is required to undertake as a component of his or her studies or training. Volunteer and unpaid work, however, does count towards the 20 hours. If an international student works more than the Australian restrictions allow, his or her visa may be cancelled.

Important Note:

Working during your stay in Australia is a great way for international students to supplement their finances. However, it is extremely important to be aware of the restrictions placed upon you as an international student. If you violate any of the restrictions, your student visa may be revoked and you could be deported out of Australia.

Work Rules for Family Members of International Students

Family members (spouses and children) accompanying the international student under their student visa have the same work rights as the student - 20 hours per week. Unlike the students, family members may not exceed 20 hours per week, even during holidays. For those students obtaining a graduate degree, like a masters degree, their family can work unlimited hours. Like students, family members are not allowed to begin work until after the student has started his or her course.

Working After Graduation

Unlike in some other English-speaking countries, there is no automatic right associated with your student visa to stay and work for a period of time in Australia after you complete your degree. When you receive your student visa, the government lets you in on a temporary basis of entry for study with the understanding that you will leave upon completion of course and before the visa will expire. Australia continues to have demand for foreign workers, and students that have earned a degree in Australia have a special work visa category. There are also several other visa categories open to international students, and Australia has a very straightforward path to permanent residency using a points system. If you want to stay and work after you graduate, you must apply and obtain a work visa.

Here are a few of the categories of visas that are available:

• 485 Skilled Graduate Temporary Visa

This visa is the most common option available to international students after graduating. With a 485 visa, you are allowed to stay in Australia for 18 months to gain work experience only if you have just completed at least two years of study in Australia.

402 Training and Research Visa

Another option for international students, the 442 visa is for students to improve their work skills for up to two years while being sponsored by an employer.

• 487 Regional Sponsored Visa

This visa provides a pathway for permanent residency while allowing you to work for 3 years and work in a specialized regional area

• 887 Skilled Regional Residence Visa

The 887 visa awards you permanent residency and with this you can live and work in Australia permanently. You must have already lived in Australia for two years, have a year of work experience and have sufficient points.

885 Skilled Independent Residence Visa

The 885 visa allows you to live as a permanent resident and work without needing to be sponsored

886 Skilled Sponsor Resident Visa

The 886 visa allows an overseas student to apply for permanent residency and work while being sponsored by an employer.

TAX FILE NUMBER

To be paid for working in Australia and pay the right amount of tax, you'll need to get a tax file number **(TFN)**. This is a unique number that stays the same even if you change your job, personal details or residency status. When you start work, your employer will ask you to fill out a Tax file number declaration to provide your **TFN**.



Migration Services:

Once arriving in Australia, many people decide that they would like to make Australia their home. Meeting eligibility requirements for a permanent visa requires you to have an established Migration Pathway that you can follow in order to meet the requirements. 

PR PATHWAY COURSES

What course should I study to get PR?

Many international students want to settle in Australia for good and fruitful career. Some students find it difficult to get PR because their education and occupation is not appropriate to be eligible for PR. This can be very costly mistake as it is known that Australian education is expensive for international students. Therefore international students, who want to qualify for PR after their studies, must have required qualifications and employable in the occupations which are in high demands at Australia. Australian government releases list of high demand occupations each year. International students who have completed their course, in any of the high demand occupation areas, have a good chance of getting PR.

The new Occupations List (STSOL & MLTSSL) has a combined lists feature over 400 eligible occupations. For those with a skill or qualification who wish to migrate to Australia choosing the correct occupation, with the correct visa, is the first important step to migration.

In order to qualify for skilled migration to Australia, you must nominate an occupation from the Medium and Long-term Strategic Skills List (MLTSSL). However, if you are applying for skilled migration via nomination by a State or Territory Government; you have the option of nominating an occupation from the Short-term Skilled Occupation List (STSOL).

If you apply for a General Skilled Migration visa and you are NOT nominated by a State or Territory Government, you must nominate an occupation from this Medium and Long-term Strategic Skills List (MLTSSL).

If you apply for a General Skilled Migration visa and you ARE nominated by a State or Territory Government, you must nominate an occupation from either this Medium and Long-term Strategic Skills List (MLTSSL) OR the Short-term Skilled Occupation List (STSOL).

Get Organised Before You Leave:

- Load copies of documents, photos, music to clud storage
- Save important contacts details and information in a Google Document
- Know your flight weight restrictions, entertainment and food

- Add something to make your lenguage identifiable
- Bring hand luggage that can be used for day trips and daily use

What to leave at home

- Stationery is readily available, there is no need to bring everything with you
- Large amounts of cash (over a \$10,000)

What customs restrictions do I need to know about?

To protect Australia's borders, unique wildlife and environment, there are some restrictions on what you can bring in. You must have documentation for any medication that you bring with you. Food, plant and animal products must also be declared. Remember, don't be sorry, just declare it. What to pack while you are coming to Australia for the first time



Some reminders of home don't belong in your suitcase: An important message from the Australian Government

Certain food, plant material and animal products cannot be brought into Australia and should not be packed in your suitcase.

While traditional food and snacks may be nice reminders of home, these items could carry pests and diseases that pose a risk to Australia's unique environment.

It is important to check Australia's biosecurity laws when preparing to bring items from overseas.

If you are unsure, don't pack it, or declare it on your Incoming Passenger Card.

If you don't answer truthfully on your Incoming Passenger Card:


- · you will get caught
- vou could be fined \$12,600
- you could face 12 months imprisonment.


Airport biosecurity clearance is quicker if you don't bring food, plant material or animal products, and most items can be purchased in Australia.

It is also important you tell your friends and family who are visiting you from overseas not to bring food, plant material or animal products into Australia. Ask them not to send these items to you in the mail, as they will be inspected at the border and sent back.

HOMESTAY

Homestay is an opportunity to live with an Australian family and experience. Australian culture by participating in the daily routine of the host family's life. Host families assist students to adapt to their new environment. Typically, a homestay includes meals, but students are responsible for the costs of washing, ironing, telephone, internet and transport. International students who are under the age of 18 are required by the Department of Immigration and Border Protection to live in a homestay or stay with a relative who is eligible to be nominated as a carer until they turn 18. Guardians are responsible for the welfare of international students who are in their care.

Independent Rentals

If you are looking to sign a contract for a rental, make sure that the rental you are looking at is the best option for you. If you have friends that are studying abroad with you or you have friends in the country, you may be able to make the overall price less because of splitting the cost of the rental. Make sure that you get the best deal for your money so that you can stay comfortable while studying in Australia.

Look for a real estate agency or two in the area or city that you are studying in. They may have rentals available for you to check out, and they may be able to work with you on the price and other important factors related to a rental. If you are looking for somewhere to live while studying in Australia, there are a couple of websites that you should definitely check out during the process.


